TEMPLE SESSIONS

To set the right spirit for the Reunion you may wish to join with many of your relatives in the Bountiful Temple the morning and afternoon of Friday, 15 June 2007.

Groups of family members might work together in organizing these temple activities.

SEALINGS: At 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. two rooms are scheduled. Four couples are needed per room per session. Family names or temple names can be used.

BAPTISMS: Adults participating must have family names. Otherwise this activity is open to youth only with endowed brethren officiating.

ENDOWMENT SESSIONS: There are no all-family endowment sessions scheduled. Sessions start every half hour throughout the day, so you can come and go as you please. Bring family names if you have them temple ready.

As a matter of fact, groups of family members might easily go to any temple in their general neighborhood for participation in endowment sessions before the wife-line getherings begin. Such groups going together would need to get session starting times to inform others in that particular group.

This temple participation will depend on your own particular family situation. Many of the wife-line getherings emphasize activities for children and youth. Please adapt for your own family's needs.

RELATIONSHIPS
