Past Reunion Facts...you can see more at miloandrus.org!

- ⇒ Milo Andrus, Jr. oversaw the first reunion held on October 9, 1905. There were 8 children and
 21 grandchildren of Milo Andrus present that day.
- ⇒ On June 14, 1926, the reunion was held at Liberty Park in Salt Lake City for the specific purpose of forming a family organization.
- ⇒ Mrs. Jeanette S. Lunt from the Genealogical Society addressed the 1926 meeting, explaining the purpose of a family organization and the duties of the officers.
- ⇒ Though some years came close, the 1948 reunion in Ucon , Idaho was the first to exceed 200 in attendance (you can see the group photo on the website).
- \Rightarrow In 1960 the reunion was held at Waterton Lakes National Park in Alberta, Canada.
