Dear Fellow Descendant,

Many descendants of Milo Andrus take strength from the accomplishments of our great pioneer ancestor. # why have an active MILO ANDRUS FAMILY ORGANIZATION?

Whenever I meet another descendant of Milo Andrus, I am impressed by the similar temperament which we share. In addition to sharing genes that give rise to shared complexion and expression, we have a number of personality traits that bind us together. To count them all, or to dwell too long on these traits would be contrary to the innate humility of these good people.

God-like life is family life. Why not establish and extend tried and true ways of knowing more about our relatives, living and dead?

A central family organization can provide a "Clearing House" for information about ancestry and descendancy. Why not reach for consistency and integrity in these kinds of information?

We all thrill in learning of the accomplishments of our relatives. Why not build on a forum for vision, direction, and encouragement for all Milo Andrus descendants who wish to participate?

We all can use encouragement that comes from knowing the people with a shared ancestry. Why not make it easier to get acquainted?

Descendants from a given wife of Milo Andrus need to be better in touch with each other to explore and identify their special ancestral heritage. Why not activate the mechanism and show examples of this kind of communication?

We all know that family relationships will be vital in our future existence. Family relationships will be important forever! Why not strengthen those family relationships now and during the coming years?

Some of the advantages to be gained require legal protection. Why not gain the strength that comes from a continuing, fully legal organization?

We all take heart from the heroic pioneers, not just the people who crossed the plains, but also those who settled the West from St. George to Alberta and beyond. Why not broadcast the greatness of Milo's children and grandchildren? At least Milo's descendants ought to know about these great men and women.

# why should you communicate with other MILO ANDRUS DESCENDANTS?

Possibly only half of Milo Andrus's grandchildren were named Andrus. Only a quarter of the great-grandchildren. In the fourth generation, only 12.5% and in the fifth, only 6.25% in this simple projection. Yet, I meet a lot of people whose great-grandmother was an Andrus, and they know it!

That relationship has diffused into many of the families descended from the Utah Pioneers and many of the families who have joined the Church since that time. The present world, sure enough, depends on relationships stemming from school and employment. Our family relationships can also be an advantage to us.

The inherent goodness, the intelligence, the charitable disposition, the leadership ability, and the diverse interests of the descendants of Milo Andrus make them a group of great people to know much better than you now do. Knowing them will strengthen you—and them.

In the past, Family Reunions served to bring such descendants together. The very diversity which makes these people interesting, the widespread places where they live, and the variety of their vocations makes a physical gathering of the numerous descendants of Milo Andrus difficult.

We live when we can communicate with many more people and with greater ease than any generation before, if we will but use the resources being presented to us.

# why have an effective MILO ANDRUS FAMILY WEB SITE?

A Web Site is the least expensive way to accomplish our goals. It is hard to communicate effectively in any other way.

#### **COMMUNICATION**

Through dynamic broadcast of current family activities, we descendants of Milo Andrus can become better acquainted with each other. Of course, we will want to provide for communication with family members who are not in the internet mode. We can continue to send out important documents and announcements by regular mail.

#### ANCESTRY RESEARCH CORRELATION

Every descendant of Milo Andrus who has cared for 5 minutes about Milo's pedigree has been stymied by the fact that solid proof of identity for any of Milo's four grandparents is lacking. Many in the past have spent a lot of time and money trying to solve those four puzzles. The Milo Andrus Family Organization with its **Web Site** can provide announcements of theories and describe research expeditions that family members are considering.

#### DESCENDANCY TRACKING CORRELATION

If the "hearts of the fathers" are to be turned to the children, then keeping track of the descendants of Milo Andrus is important to him, his wives, and his children. Almost all of the grandchildren of Milo Andrus are now passed on. We who are living should have complete records about those who are no longer with us and such records should be readily available. Information about living people can be abbreviated, so that no living person's privacy is invaded.
