PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

few months ago, I received a phone call from someone who said his name was **Roger Price**, and he asked me if **Paul Andrus**, who had been a pilot in the Army Air Corps during World War II, was my father. When I said yes, Roger explained that his father, **Jack Price**, had been the tail gunner and part of a three-man crew on an A-20 with my dad in the Pacific theater. They went through training together and then were together in New Guinea, the Philippines, and Okinawa, and flew bombing missions against the Japanese.

I was astounded to make this connection. Dad had spoken very little about his experiences in WWII, so I knew very little about that part of his life. A few weeks after this call, I had dinner with Roger and his son Ben. Roger provided me with several journal pages my dad had sent to his mother when his father passed away. These pages discussed their experiences together and provided priceless insights and stories I had never heard before. The following is an excerpt of one of those stories.

... We were both thrilled to find out that we were assigned to A-20 Aircraft, and since Jack was a gunner and I was a pilot, we determined then and there that we would try to be assigned to the same crew so that we could go overseas together. However, Jack was ordered to begin his training at Charlotte, North Carolina, one class ahead of me, and I was assigned up to Charlotte several weeks later . . . Jack felt very confident in speaking with his officers and said he would talk with his commanding officer about it. The commanding officer explained to Jack that it was not possible to put him on my crew because he was a class ahead of me and had already been assigned to his pilot. If they reassigned him, they would have to hold back his entire crew, and this they would not do. We felt badly about this but decided to talk to my commanding officer about it. My commanding officer gave me the same answer, saying emphatically there was no way it could be done.

Jack and I then decided we would fast and pray and ask the Lord to open up the way so that we could be assigned to the same crew. As we were fasting, we knelt together in Jack's barracks one Sunday after church and prayed that the Lord would grant our desire.

ilo Andrus is my great, great grandfather, through his eighth wife, Jane Lancaster Munday. What does that mean to me? I guess the meaning for me comes in two parts.

The first part is the connection it gives me to the rise of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. As my family has studied the *Doctrine and Covenants* in *Come Follow Me* this year, I know that my ancestors were present during many of the experiences we have read about. This includes Zion's Camp; building and the dedication of the Kirtland Temple; settling Nauvoo and building that temple. Reflecting on my ancestors' connection to these events helps them come alive for me.

My wife and I recently finished reading **Mark Henshaw**'s wonderful book, *Forty Years*, about the building of the Salt Lake Temple. The book also includes accounts of the westward migration, settling of the Salt Lake Valley, the construction of the railroads and the building of the St. George Temple. Again, I felt much more interested in these events, knowing that my ancestors participated in them.

The second part of what being descended from Milo means to me is that I belong to a large world-wide family. Many years ago, I spent a few weeks in Madrid, Spain. While there, I attended the English-speaking ward (at the time nicknamed the Serviceman's Ward). One Sunday, a couple came up to me and said, "Andrus, hmmm. Do you happen to know XYZ Andrus? He was our bishop when we lived in the States." I did in fact, know XYZ. He was a close relative. I also had a similar experience when serving as a missionary in Argentina.

Our youngest son went to Korea on his mission. While there, he had this same kind of experience. "Andrus, hmmm. Do you know XYZ Andrus?"

My personal experience is that from Argentina to Spain to Korea, our Andrus family is known for good. I am sure most of us have had these kinds of experiences. It is one of the great blessings of being part of this great family.

A few days later the pilot to whom Jack had been assigned was up flying alone in the airplane. When he returned to the base, a fog had rolled in, making the visibility very poor. As he came into land he was not lined up correctly with the runway, so that after rolling some distance on the hard surface, his airplane went off the runway and flipped over on its back.

There was no fire, and his pilot appeared to be uninjured; however, they examined him at the hospital and discovered that he had cracked a vertebrae that required medical treatment before he could continue with his training. This left Jack without a pilot. His commanding officer, remembering his request, assigned him to my crew. Although Jack's pilot did suffer a cracked vertebrae, he was otherwise not injured—and we acknowledge it was a marvelous and miraculous answer to our prayers.

I am grateful to Milo, and to my dad and Jack Price, and to the Lord, for their examples and the ways our lives are woven together to teach and bless and provide strength in times of need.

DO YOU HAVE UNCLAIMED PROPERTY?

The **State of Utah** conducted an outreach campaign in September 2021, highlighting that 1 in 5 Utah residents has unclaimed property totaling \$52 million. Announcements were aired through television and radio news, and online (see <u>KSL News link</u>).

Utah State Treasurer, **Marlo Oaks**, reported, "Every Utahn should go online at least once a year to find and claim their property—and check for family, friends, deceased relatives and organizations they support as well."

The Milo Andrus Family Organization is in the process of claiming a \$194 refund.

Our thanks to family member, **Emilee Andrus** for providing a reader comment about this! More than 300 Andrus names are listed with unclaimed property. A number of refunds have been claimed successfully
